Outdoor learning

Explore the natural world using all of my senses.

Understanding the world

- Exploring a range of vehicles past and present.
- Exploring different materials and testing some to make boats
- Identify a map of the UK and learn about the capital city of England - London
- Learning about the word 'God' and what this means – introduction to the Creation Story
- Learn about the life of the pilot Amelia Earhart

Expressive arts and design

- Designing our own vehicles using a range of building resources – such as Duplo/Lego etc
- Introduction to our wood work bench and beginning to join two pieces of materials together.
- Learn how to make a simple axle for a vehicle.
- Learn about the sculptures of Barbara Hepworth.
- Collaboratively design and build a junk modelling sculpture.
- Make our own vehicles using a range of manmade and/or natural materials.

Maths

Preschool

Building counting confidence. Exploring numerals 1-10. Sequencing and positional language.

Reception

Exploring numbers to 20 and beyond. Consolidating adding and taking away a number. Shape work – using shapes for a purpose, looking at arrangements and copying shapes. Sharing and grouping.

Communication and language

Use topic vocabulary correctly (see next page) and understand the meaning of these new words.

Preschool –. Building story language and developing understanding of comprehension questions.

Reception – being able to listen and comprehend what has been said, Be able to explain why you like a character or story and to find a word which means....

Personal, social & emotional development

- Learning about people who help us who are they and what do they do?
- Learning how to be a good friend and what this means.
- Becoming more aware of others needs and emotions.
- Learning ways we can solve conflict and how we show respect towards others.

Being able to read words with shorter vowel sounds. Reading and writing longer words and compound words.

Writing a simple sentence/caption with a full stop. Including spaces between words.

This half term we are focusing on Dance! Children will be taught to join movements together to create a motif. They will work with others to create a short dance by developing movements created to music. Children will remember and perform a short dance and evaluate and improve their dances

Fine motor skills


Daily funky finger activities. Starting with large body movement and progressing to finer hand manipulation.
