Amazing animals

The school rule that we will focus on is being kind and helpful



Outdoor learning

Explore the natural world using all of my senses.

We are often outside within the school grounds or on a welly walk. Please ensure your child has suitable clothes at school (a warm and waterproof coat, hat, gloves, wellies and a change of clothes).

Understanding the world

Know scientific and geographical facts relating to our topic (see next page).

Know facts about Chinese New Year and how it is celebrated. Recognise and taste Chinese food.

Learn how to use directional language and how to give a set of instructions for a bee-bot to follow (programmable toy)

Expressive arts and design

Learn to sing and perform new songs, rhymes and poems. Learn that pitch is how high or low a sound is

Recognise the art of Henri Rousseau and create art inspired by his paintings.

Weekly drawing challenges to progress our mark making skills.

Use natural resources to create animal enclosures. Explore modelling clay to create an imaginary animal or dragon.

Maths

Preschool – Subitise to 3 and learn about the composition of numbers up to 5.

Reception – Subitise to 6, learn about zero Represent, sort and order numbers up to 8 including 1 more and 1 less.

Recognise and order numerals

Explore and compare weight & height and talk about time.

Communication and language

Use topic vocabulary correctly (see next page) and understand the meaning of these new words. **Preschool** – Building an understanding of language. Listening and responding appropriately. **Reception** – To make predictions about stories and explain why something happened.

Personal, social & emotional development

Learn acts of kindness. How to use our words and actions to be kind to others.

Learn about what a 'goal' is and set out our own ones to work towards.

Learn how everyone has their own strengths and interests. Build up perseverance and resilience when faced with a challenge

Phonics

Preschool – Learn to hear and identify environmental sounds. Explore and play with alliteration.

Reception Learn to read and write words containing the following phonemes - ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, er.

Read new tricky words – was, you, they, my, by, all, are, sure, pure.

Write more letters that are correctly formed and are recognisable.

Orally compose a simple sentence and hold it in memory before attempting to write it.

Physical development

Gross motor skills – Develop the ability to throw, catch and kick a ball and use a racket or bat.

Learn to move in different ways by navigating the large equipment in the hall, develop body control, balance and coordination with yoga poses and sequences, move freely to music

Fine motor skills Use one handed tools effectively with a comfortable grip such as scissors, paint brushes, pencils, chalk

Use fingers to manipulate dough and small construction pieces. Digging and planting.

Outcomes will vary depending on the child's age and stage of development and their time in our setting.
