**Charity Status** 

We are now a registered charity!

On 23 January 2024, we received formal notification from the Charity Commission for England & Wales that our registration had been accepted and our registered charity number is 1206655.

As far as most of our parents and staff are concerned, little will change but it does mean that anyone can now search the Charity Commission's website to find out about our charity for information such as:

- · Who the trustees are:
- · What are our rules and regulations (our constitution); and
- · What our accounts show.

The formal constitution was put in place at the AGM which was held on 12 December 2023 and it was then that this year's committee was elected. We will stay in place until this year's AGM (which will hopefully be held in September 2024) at which the members of the PTFA (the parents, carers and staff) will receive a report on what we've done this year, our accounts for the year just ended (to 31 August) and that will be the time to elect next year's committee (who stay in place for one year).

That will be your opportunity to get involved with the PTFA as a committee member. The duties are not onerous and mainly just involve attending a short zoom committee meeting (usually once a month apart from during the holidays), deciding what events we can put on to raise funds for the school and then deciding how those events are going to be run, quite good fun really!

We are going to need some additional members in the next eighteen months or so as most of the current committee will be retiring when children move on to their new schools so, please, start volunteering as and when you can.

Finally, thanks for all your help in the past and we look forward to meeting you all at lots of exciting functions this year (and when the lolly sales start!). Remember, our children's lives at school are that much richer, and their activities that much cheaper, with the support of the PTFA.
